Selah Technologies selected for Atlanta venture conference

Pendleton-based Selah Technologies LLC will present at the third annual Southeast Venture Conference in Atlanta – the only South Carolina firm among 40 presenting companies named thus far.

“Members of our management team have attended this event in the past, but this is the first year in which we have applied to present,” said Michael Bolick, president and chief executive of Selah Technologies. “The conference is a high-energy event focused on pairing high-growth entrepreneurial companies with sources of funding.”

On March 11-12, 40 companies from the Southeast and Mid-Atlantic regions will present to an audience representing over \$60 billion in private equity capital at Intercontinental Buckhead hotel in Atlanta.

“Primarily, we hope to gain further exposure for Selah and to publicize the progress we are making,” Bolick said. “Of course, we are always looking to grow and fund advancements in the business, and SEVC will give us this opportunity.”

Selah Technologies was formed in 2006 following InnoVenture, a conference for investors, inventors and entrepreneurs held annually at the Carolina First Center in Greenville. The advanced materials manufacturing company is developing and commercializing two proprietary nanotechnologies out of labs at Clemson University.

Bolick now serves on the selection committee for InnoVenture, which will take place March 24-25. The 13-member committee is narrowing 45 applicants for 10-15 presenter slots.

“InnoVenture is a critical part of the developing collaborative entrepreneurial community in our region,” he said. “Indeed, Selah is on the map because of InnoVenture.”

Selah Technologies is the only presenting company at SEVC from South Carolina.

“The selection process at SEVC is very competitive, so our selection is a testament to our business strategy and the progress we are making,” Bolick said.
